
# **Color Palette Iterations**

In the studio branding project, I worked on my version of a stylescape. With the colors I was unsure. I wanted to go for a minimalist, luxurious, professional design.


#### First iteration


#### Second iteration

## Third (final) iteration




### Peer feedback
